

01 - VOCABULARY: FEELINGS AND PREPOSITIONS



Feelings with the preposition **ABOUT**

- ✓ Crazy/mad (ex: he's crazy about her)
- ✓ Happy (ex: I am not altogether happy about the decision)
- ✓ Excited (ex: They were really excited about the project)
- ✓ Sad (ex: I was sad about the friends I was leaving behind)
- ✓ Nervous (ex: Quite a lot of people are still nervous about flying)
- ✓ Anxious (ex: Tom is anxious about his exam results)
- ✓ Worried (ex: I'm worried about washing that shirt in case it shrinks)
- ✓ Upset (ex: David's very upset about losing his job)

Feelings with the preposition **AT**

✓ Surprised (ex: I was very much surprised at the news)

Feelings with the preposition **OF**

- ✓ Afraid (ex: You don't have to be afraid of what you are!)
- ✓ Tired (ex: I'm tired of your constant complaints!)
- ✓ Envious (ex: She was envious of her sister's beauty)
- ✓ Jealous (ex: Why are you so jealous of his success?)
- ✓ Fond (ex: boys are fond of playing football)

Feelings with the preposition **ON**

✓ keen (ex: John's always been keen on music)

Feelings with the preposition **TO**

- ✓ Good (ex: Please don't pretend to be good to me!)
- ✓ Kind (ex: the teacher was always very kind to her students)
- ✓ Rude (ex: Why are you so rude to your mother?)
- ✓ Attracted (ex: He was attracted to her sweetness and innocence)

Feelings with the preposition WITH

- ✓ Angry (ex: I'm angry with my son)
- ✓ Bored (ex: I get the impression that he is bored with his job)
- ✓ **Disappointed** (ex : He was really disappointed with the result)
- ✓ Fed up (I'm fed up with waiting for her)
- ✓ Satisfied (ex: are you satisfied with your new car?)
