- **Look forward to + verb(ing)** non vedere l'ora di
 - Example: I **look forward to meeting** you at the party.

- **Be used to + verb(ing)** avere l'abitudine di
 - Example: She **is used to working** late at night.

- **Be interested in + verb(ing)** essere interessato a
 - Example: They **are interested in learning** new languages.

- **Be afraid of + verb(ing)** aver paura di
 - Example: He **is afraid of flying** over the ocean.

- **Be good at + verb(ing)** essere bravo a
 - Example: Sarah **is good at drawing** portraits.

- **Be tired of + verb(ing)** essere stanco di
 - Example: I **am tired of waiting** for the bus.

- **Feel like + verb(ing)** avere voglia di
 - Example: I **feel like going** to the beach today.

- **Think about + verb(ing)** pensare a (fare qualcosa)
 - Example: We **thought about moving** to another city.

- **Have difficulty (in) + verb(ing)** avere difficoltà
 - Example: He **has difficulty understanding** math.

- **Spend time + verb(ing)** passare il tempo a
 - Example: They **spent the afternoon playing** tennis.

- **Can't help + verb(ing)** non riuscire a fare a meno di
 - Example: I **can't help laughing** at his jokes.
- **Be keen on + verb(ing)** essere appassionato a
 - Example: She **is keen on swimming** every morning.
- **Be capable of + verb(ing)** essere capace di
 - Example: He **is capable of solving** difficult problems.
- **Be worried about + verb(ing)** essere preoccupato di
 - Example: She **is worried about missing** the train.
- **Be involved in + verb(ing)** essere coinvolto in
 - Example: He **is involved in organizing** the event.
- **Can't stand + verb(ing)** non sopportare
 - Example: I **can't stand waiting** in long lines.
- **Be accustomed to + verb(ing)** essere abituato a
 - Example: She **is accustomed to working** in a fast-paced environment.
- **Be dedicated to + verb(ing)** essere concentrato/dedito a
 - Example: They **are dedicated to improving** their skills.
- **Be passionate about + verb(ing)** essere appassionato di
 - Example: She **is passionate about travelling** the world.
- **Regret + verb(ing)** pentirsi di
 - Example: I **regret not going** to the party last night.
- **Advise + someone + to + verb** consigliare a qualcuno di
 - Example: I **advise you to take** the bus instead of driving.
- **Warn + someone + to + verb** avvisare qualcuno di
 - Example: She **warned me to be careful** on the icy road.

- **Help + someone + to + verb** aiutare qualcuno a
 - Example: Can you **help me to carry** these boxes?
- **Remind + someone + to + verb** rammentare a qualcuno di
 - Example: She **reminded me to call** my mom.
- **Encourage + someone + to + verb** incoraggiare a qualcuno di
 - Example: They **encouraged us to try** the new restaurant.
- **Force + someone + to + verb** obbligare qualcuno a
 - Example: The teacher **forced the student to complete** the assignment.
- **Expect + someone + to + verb** aspettarsi che qualcuno...
 - Example: We **expect her to arrive** by 3 p.m.
- **Allow + someone + to + verb** permettere a qualcuno di
 - Example: The manager **allowed us to leave** early.
- **Promise + to + verb** promettere di
 - Example: I **promise to help** you with your homework.
- **Pretend + to + verb** fingere di
 - Example: He **pretended to be** sick to avoid going to work.
- **Plan + to + verb** programmare di
 - Example: They **plan to travel** abroad next summer.
- **Offer + to + verb** offrirsi di (fare)
 - Example: She **offered to help** me with my presentation.
- **Need + to + verb** aver bisogno di
 - Example: I **need to finish** this report by tomorrow.
- **Forget + to + verb** dimenticare di
 - Example: I **forgot to buy** the bread on my way home.

- Try + to + verb provare a
 - Example: He **tried to open** the door, but it was locked.
- Decide + to + verb decidere di
 - Example: We **decided to visit** the museum after lunch.
- Refuse + to + verb rifiutarsi di
 - Example: He **refused to answer** the phone call.
- Seem + to + verb sembrare di
 - Example: She **seems to enjoy** her new job.
- Appear + to + verb sembrare di
 - Example: It **appears to be** a very expensive restaurant.
- Ask + someone + to + verb chiedere a qualcuno di
 - Example: She **asked me to help** her with the project.
- Want + someone + to + verb volere che qualcuno faccia...
 - Example: I **want you to finish** this task by tomorrow.
- Hate + verb(ing) odiare (fare qualcosa)
 - Example: He **hates swimming** in cold water.
- Love + verb(ing) amare (fare qualcosa)
 - Example: I **love reading** before bed.
- Like + verb(ing) piacere (fare qualcosa)
 - Example: She **likes painting** in her free time.
- Prefer + verb(ing) preferire (fare qualcosa)
 - Example: They **prefer running** to cycling.
- Admit + verb(ing) ammettere (di aver fatto)
 - Example: She **admitted cheating** on the test.

- **Deny + verb(ing)** **negare (di aver fatto)**

- Example: He **denied taking** the last cookie.

- **Suggest + verb(ing)** **suggerire (di fare)**

- Example: I **suggest taking** a break after the meeting.

- **Recommend + verb(ing)** **consigliare (di fare)**

- Example: He **recommended going** to the new restaurant.

- **Consider + verb(ing)** **considerare (se fare)**

- Example: I **consider moving** to a new city.
