



04 - VOCABULARY: A LIST OF TASTES



What does it taste like?

Sour: one of the less pleasant sensations. Example: vinegar, lemons, or candy that makes you pucker up!

Sweet: The most pleasing taste sensation. Example: sugary candy, ice cream, and other tasty treats!

Salty: A taste sensation that some people like, and some people don't. Example: potato chips, french fries

Bitter: The most harsh, unpleasant taste. Everyone's least-favorite taste sensation. Example: "Black" coffee, pure dark chocolate, plain radishes, dangerous inedible things

Crunchy: Pleasant, firm and fresh; makes a loud noise when you chew it. Example: crackers, lettuce, carrot, celery

Slimy: something that feels slippery and gooey when you taste it. Example: pudding, jello, melted cheese, gravy, syrup

Tasty: A pleasing thing to taste. Another way to say it: Delicious

Disgusting: A very unpleasing thing to taste! Other ways to say it: Gross, Icky, Nasty

Acidic: food that is sharp-tasting and sour

Mild: something that is not sharp in taste or smell

Savoury: salty or spicy, not sweet (ex: a savoury pie)

Spicy: seasoned or containing spice (synonym: **hot**)

Syrupy: something that tastes like syrup

Creamy: something that tastes soft and smooth like cream

Zesty: something that has a citrus flavour
